INITIAL

Florida Staff Credential can be met by ONE of the following:

- 1. An active National Early Childhood Credential (NECC).
 - a. Child Development Associate (CDA)
 - b. National Child Care Association
 - c. Association Montessori Internationale (AMI)
 - d. American Montessori Society (AMS)
 - e. Montessori Accreditation Council for Teacher Education

2. Formal Educational Qualifications

- a. BA, BS, or advanced degree in **ONE** of the following areas:
 - i. Early Childhood Education/Child Development
 - ii. Pre-Kindergarten or Primary Education
 - iii. Preschool Education
 - iv. Family and Consumer Sciences (formerly Home Economics/Child Development)
 - v. Exceptional Student Education
 - vi. Special Education
 - vii. Mental Disabilities
 - viii. Specific Learning Disabilities
 - ix. Physically Impaired
 - x. Varying Exceptionalities
 - xi. Emotional Disabilities
 - xii. Visually Impaired
 - xiii. Hearing Impaired
 - xiv. Speech-Language Pathology
 - xv. Elementary Education with certification to teach any age birth through 6th grade (certification may be inactive provided the certificate is not suspended/revoked).
- b. A.S, A.A. degree or higher in Early Childhood Education/Child Development
- c. Associate's degree or higher in **WITH** at least six (6) college credit hours in early childhood education/child development **AND** at least 480 hours of experience in a child care setting serving children ages birth through eight (8)
- **3.** An active <u>Birth Through Five Child Care Credential</u>, which can be met by **ONE** of the following:
 - a. Florida Child Care Professional Certificate (FCCPC)
 - b. Florida Department of Education Child Care Apprenticeship Certificate (CCAC)
 - c. Early Childhood Professional Certificate (ECPC)

- 4. An active School-Age Child Care Credential, which can be met by **ONE** of the following:
 - a. Florida Child Care Professional Credential (FCCPC)
 - b. School-Age Professional Certificate (SAPC)

NOTE: A School-Age FCCPC will not be accepted to meet the minimum staff credential requirements for Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten (VPK))

RENEWAL

Florida Staff Credential Renewal can be met by ONE of the following:

- 1. National Early Childhood Credentials:
- a. As an Birth Through Five (FCCPC) by submitting the <u>Florida Child Care Staff Credential</u> <u>Verification Application</u>, CF-FSP Form 5211, October 2017, with renewal requirements attached;
- b. By the organization that issued the original credential.

OR

2. Birth Through Five and School-Age Child Care Credentials the Florida Child Care Staff Credential Verification Application, CF-FSP Form 5211, October 2017 outlines the renewal requirements.
